By the way, Ed was also involved in the 1960 Championship team doing color commentary for Bill Campbell's play-by-play. Television in 1960 was handled by member Jack Whitaker and color by the late Bosh Pritchard.

Congratulations to **Ed Hurst**, again! A recent note from Cissy indicates that he has been

chosen as an individual who reflects an important part of the industry of broadcasting in Philadelphia.
