The last line of the last item indicates what a terrible summer it has been for Pioneers. We lost our President, **Ed Papazian**, on Thursday, June 27. He was buried on Monday, July 1. New President **Bill Webber** graciously agreed to fill the terrific void that was left by his loss, and Bill sent out at the time a letter to all members which included an obituary. Thirty-five members and eight past Presidents of Pioneers attended the funeral.

We also lost **Bill Bransome**, who for many years did news and sports on KYW Newsradio, and became a legend in Philadelphia broadcasting. He was President of AFTRA and national board member. Bill was 84 and died of cardiac arrest on June 24. His pacemaker failed and was replaced the day before his death. A veteran of WWII and the 45th Infantry Division, he was awarded a Purple Heart and Bronze Star. Bill received the 1970 Sportscaster of the Year Award of the UP Hall of Fame, and the AFTRA George Heller Award.

Dick Paisley, a Pioneers member, who worked at WFIL, and was GM at WRCV died on August 16 at 83. He had been ill for some time. Dick was with Jan Savitt's Top Hatters band when he was quite young and in WWII—he was in the US Navy. Dick said his hero was Roger Clipp. Last year Dick was the recipient of the Life Achievement Award of the PAB.

Helene Sperka, widow of Hank Sperka, who lived in Stuart, Fl died at age 70 of cancer. She will be remembered as Chairperson of the Board of the Philadelphia Advertising Club 1979-1981. (Thanks to her friends Leila Brenner and Vicky Benedict Farber for information on Helene.)

And our many Temple University Communications School members note with sadness the passing of **Delwyn Dusenbury**, 83, who taught TV and radio acting, and production.
