In last month's report on **Diego Constellanos'** 35th Anniversary of Puerto Rican Panorama we told you the station presented him with a gigantic crystal bowl engraved with Diego's name and the 6 ABC logo. Diego has updated this report to include the fact that the presentation was made by **Rebecca Campbell**, WPVI-TV President and General Manager. The show began on WFIL TV 6 and is the longest running show in English dealing with Latin culture and Hispanic issues on television. We note with sadness the death of Radio Pioneer and B-101 co-owner David L. Kurtz. David was 73 and had an extended bout with cancer. Kurtz was Chairman, Treasurer and Co-owner with Jerry Lee. The station began with seven staffers, and Jerry Lee was picked from among them to become co-owner. The station was founded as WDVR-FM in 1963 when FM was considered more of a novelty than a business. In 1980 it became WEAZ, and in 1993 WBEB-B101. The station soon had the largest audience of any station in the country, including New York and Los Angeles. It was the first FM station in the
